The Detroit Concert Choir is an award-winning vocal ensemble celebrated for exceptional programming and distinctive performances. The choir, established in 1987 by founding director Gordon Nelson, is now in its 37th season and has been under the artistic leadership of Dr. Michael Mitchell since June 2019. Dr. Mitchell is also the Director of Choral Activities at Oakland University.

Dedicated to promoting choral music of high artistic merit and cultural enrichment for the community, DCC is comprised of musicians of varying ages and backgrounds, including educators, students, professionals, and music enthusiasts. Gathering from over 35 communities, the 75-voice choir performs in some of the Detroit area's most beautiful and historic churches and performing arts centers.

Repertoire includes contemporary literature, *a cappella* compositions, American folk and gospel, and great classical works for chorus and orchestra. In addition to the choir's own concert series, the ensemble performs at community events and collaborates with fellow choruses and world-renowned orchestras.

DCC Rehearsals are held on Monday evenings (7-9pm) from late August through May in alternating locations, including vocal rooms at Grosse Pointe North High School and Birmingham Groves High School. Our concert series includes performances in October, December, March, and May. DCC typically performs 7-10 concerts a year.

- Attend all rehearsals and performances promptly with a commitment to regular rehearsal attendance.
- Bring a positive and artistic mindset to each rehearsal to raise the level of artistry.

• Come prepared to rehearsal with a dedication to excellence. Study music between weekly rehearsals.

- Read weekly Singer Notes and stay informed.
- Pay all required member and music fees when due.
- Communicate with the staff and director regarding schedule conflicts.
- Be supportive of DCC performances, fundraisers, and community outreach through participation, volunteerism, and promotion.
- Promote the activities of the DCC, including concerts, special events, partnerships, and collaborations.
- Serve as a positive, goodwill representative of the organization.

Detroit Concert Choir members are responsible for the following upon acceptance:

- Annual Membership Fee, currently \$85.00 payable to DCC
- Purchase of music (repertoire for each concert approximately four times per year)
- Purchase of black formal concert attire. Guidelines are provided upon acceptance into the ensemble.
- Black music folder (each choir member's responsibility to purchase)
